2015 CHASS Theatre recipient David Friedman

Who can forget David Friedman performing "It All Fades Away" from "The Bridges of Madison County" at the Dali for the CHASS awards ceremony? David graduated from Blake High School and has begun his freshman year in the prestigious BFA Musical Theatre program at Penn State. On June 5, he was one of only 25 students awarded the "Arts for Life" scholarship from Foundation for Excellence in Education, which is Jeb and Columba Bush's foundation. He also performed at the award event in Miami. In addition, David has been nominated for a "Tampa Bay Theatre Award" for "Best Lead Actor in a Play" for "The Chosen." The play was also nominated for "Best Play."







2015 CHASS Instrumental Music recipient Mark Trotter (French Horn) was one of four Floridians accepted into the National Youth Orchestra of the United States. He joined its Concert Tour of China and Hong Kong following a kick-off concert at Carnegie Hall. Mark says he "absolutely enjoyed a multi-disciplinary arts week in Miami as a 2015 YoungArts Winner, landing first official YouTube posts, John Williams Horn Concerto: V Nocturne." Mark is also a 2015 BIG Arts Scholarship winner. He is attending Northwestern University Bienen Music Conservatory in Evanston, after considering acceptance letters from Juilliard, Northwestern, and New England Conservatory.

Mark wrote to TBBCA: "Thank you so much for your investment in my career—it is an enormous encouragement to a young, aspiring classical musician. You have given a gift that has brought me steps closer to my goal and I am very excited about my future at Northwestern University and future career as a hornist with a major symphony orchestra."


Benefits of TBBCA pARTnerships Expanded – Cultural Encounters
